Concept Note

Background

Roots & Shoots is a global community action program founded by Dr. Jane Goodall in 1991. It is a global movement that aims to bring together youth from all walks of life towards one goal - the betterment of our environment. The Roots & Shoots program believes that everyone can make a positive change in the world, no matter where we come from, by coming together as a community and taking action.

JGI India -Jane Goodall Institute, India, aims at promoting a culture of coexistence between all-natural species - people, animals, and the environment. Dr Jane Goodall founded this institution in the hope of harnessing human power to protect all lives around us by honouring them. JGI India hopes to enable youth to work collaboratively and harmoniously to create and maintain a healthy environment through our educational programs and many other inspiring projects.

ChimpanZoo was established in 1984 as a collective effort between Jane Goodall Institute, Zoo facilities, and universities. ChimpanZoo is an international research program that is dedicated to the study of chimpanzees in zoos and other captive settings. It is by far the largest ape research program ever undertaken. This research program aims to increase awareness about the plight of chimpanzees and also help in understanding their behaviour better. It also assists zoos to build healthier habitats followed by sharing and exchange of crucial information drawing from its research database, which further helps in enriching the lives of the chimpanzees.

Objectives

The specific objectives are listed as follows:

1. To share knowledge and information about ChimpanZoo International Research Program.
2. To discuss ideas on integrated and collaborative management, educational outreach, and data collection methods of chimpanzees in zoos.
3. To participate in networking and ideate collaborations with several zoos and educational institutions.

Expected Outcomes

1. A better understanding of the administration system in the zoos and other captive settings focusing on chimpanzee welfare.
2. To facilitate the exchange of information and knowledge about the ChimpanZoo programme to attendees.
