Concept Note

Background

India is one of the few countries in the world where environmental education (EE) is compulsory at all levels of formal education. This outcome was achieved through the efforts of the National Council for Education Research and Training (NCERT) in response to a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) regarding compulsory EE, filed by Shri M. C. Mehta in 1991 in the Honourable Supreme Court.

India adopted the infusion approach to EE throughout the formal education system; serving students ages 6-18. The infusion approach entails incorporating EE into the existing curricula of various subjects, as well as the development of project-based activities.

Objective

The session will reflect on and discuss the experience compulsory of EE, reflect on the successes and failures, and suggest ways forward.

Expected outcome

Recommendation to prepare a road map for the next 25 years to deliver quality Environmental Education.
